THE PROBLEM

Temporary outdoor playground courts unavailable

Courts are not available for play while OPA school is in session When school bond passes the Community school will be demolished and courts may be removed



Formed the Pickleball Facility Committee (PFC) of Sequim

Dec 2014 – City of Sequim publishes draft Parks and Rec Master Plan. Draft lists \$30K for pickleball scheduled for 2019. This spurred pickleball players to organize and respond to the the plan.

Dec 2014 – Formed the Pickleball Facility Committee (PFC) Of Sequim. Joanne Yerkes agreed to chair the first PFC. We asked the City to move funding up to 2016. Mayor Pratt supported our cause "We need to focus on building courts" she said.

Jan 7, 2015 – PFC commissioned the Court Construction and Facility Planning Sub-Committee (Charlie). Prepared the PFC court requirements document.

Jan 7, 2015 – PFC commissioned the site review committee (Marc and Richard). Reviewed 7 possible Court sites suitable for 8 courts.

Feb 23, 2015 – Sequim Parks and Rec Master Plan amended to move up pickleball courts to 2016.

Oct 2015 – PFC developed a fundraising strategy to fund new courts



Why Pickleball courts are good for Sequim!

- Pickleball is the fastest growing sport in the USA
- Provides youth with lifelong racket sport skills
- Increases youth activity and health
- Increases longevity and health of all players (recent cohort study identifies that racket sport participation reduced chance of death by 47%)
- Increases community social activity and interaction. Decreases sedentary lifestyle
- Future tournaments will increase tourism and bring pickleball players to Sequim from around the country
- Sequim does not have any permanent public courts
- Sequim Parks & Rec Master Plan & Carrie Blake Park Master Plan call for pickleball courts at Carrie Blake Park




Planned 16' wide corridor between each set of 4 courts.






Sample center corridor information board

Our favorite gathering table from 3rd and Fir gets a new coat of paint before installation in the new court corridor


